In completing & submitting the Booking Form and payment of deposit and / or final payment, you acknowledge receipt & acceptance of these Terms and agree to be bound by these conditions which constitute the agreement between Canadian Globetrotters and you.

1.How to Book

To reserve your place on one of the Journeys, you should complete the Booking Form and send it, together with a non-refundable deposit of \$ 300/- per person per trip. Some journeys require an additional non-refundable deposit or instant payment for a Permit or Airfare. Please refer to our Website or individual Proposal for an explanation.

2. Reservations Early reservations are recommended. All services are strictly on a request basis, both for air travel & land requirements and subject to availability of seats and hotel / lodge / camp rooms. Reservations made for travel within 60 days will require full payment at the time of reservation. In the event of services requested not being available, alternative services will be offered. If alternative services are not acceptable, your payment will be refunded in full. Some suppliers may require higher deposit and the same will be advised to you at the time of booking. Please be aware that some airfares require full payment at time of booking and will be advised to you accordingly.

3. Payments

5 Tour Price
